Some nouns have different meanings between their singular and plural forms.

Here are some examples below:



Brain Fueled

Arm – upper limbs of the body <i>"He fell and broke his right arm."</i>
Arms – weapons and ammunition "The criminals surrendered by force of arms."
Regard – careful thought or attention "She has no regard for the welfare of others."
Regards – best wishes, express respect <i>"He sends his warm regards."</i>
Moral – a lesson, of right and wrong behavior <i>"The moral of the story."</i>
Morals – rules of conduct <i>"He has no morals."</i>
Physic – medicine <i>"He knew the proper physic."</i>
Physics – science of matter and energy <i>"He studied physics in college."</i>
Custom – a tradition "This is a traditional English custom."
Customs – government office that collect duties "We went through customs on our return."
Iron – a useful metal "The box is made of metal."
Irons – in shackles or fetters "Irons were necessary for the prisoners."
Look – the act of one's gaze in order to see <i>"Let me get a closer look."</i>
Looks – the appearance of someone or something <i>"He is losing his good looks."</i>
Content – state of peaceful happiness <i>"He seemed very content."</i>
Contents – things that are held or included <i>"They removed the box contents."</i>
Wood – hard fibrous material comes from trees "We need more wood for the fireplace."
Woods – an area of land, small forest <i>"The kids were lost in the woods."</i>
