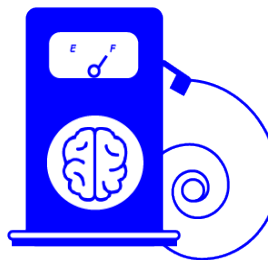

Adverbs

An adverb is a word that describes an action verb.



Brain Fueled

An adverb can describe how an action happens.

Example: Jason **quickly** read the book.

How did Jason read? Quickly.



An adverb can describe when an action happens.

Example: Emma left **early**.

When did Emma leave? Early.



An adverb can describe where an action happens.

Example: Mary ran **here**.

Where did Mary run? Here.
